

**OFFICIAL SUMMARY PROCEEDINGS
OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, TETON COUNTY, WYOMING**

The Teton County Board of Commissioners met in regular meeting on **July 5, 2022** in the Commissioners Chambers located at 200 S. Willow in Jackson. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Public comment was given by Maureen Murphy, Teton County Clerk regarding updates on the election.
Public comment was given by Tim Young regarding Teton Mobility Project.

MATTERS FROM COMMISSION AND STAFF

6. Consideration of FY2023 Task Work Orders for BUILD Grant Consultant

Heather Overholser, Director of Public works, presented to the Board for consideration of approval six individual Task Work Order Agreements for FY2023 with Jorgensen Associates, Inc. for BUILD Grant Administration and Project Component design and management, four of which are amendments to previously approved Task Work Orders (TWOs 1-4), and two of which are new Task Work Orders (TWOs 5 and 6). These are to be considered under the Master Agreement that was entered into with Jorgensen Associates on June 21, 2021.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Newcomb and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to approve FY2023 amendments to Task Work Orders 1 through 4, as well as approval of new Task Work Orders 5 and 6, with Jorgensen Associates, Inc. for BUILD Grant Administration, Project Component design and management, community outreach and engagement, real estate services, and construction administration. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

11. Consideration of Contract for the Teton Mobility Project

Heather Overholser, Director of Public Works, and Brian Schilling, Pathways Coordinator, presented to the Board for consideration of approval a notice of award for professional services with Flitner Strategies, Inc. for stakeholder engagement and strategic planning for the adoption of the Teton Mobility Project final report and project list.

The Town of Jackson/Teton County Pathways program has been working with Friends of Pathways and Alta Planning over the past two years to update the 2007 Pathways Master Plan and identify a prioritized project list that will guide the next 10+ years of active transportation projects in Jackson Hole. The final report and proposed project list are ready to bring to the Town Council and County Commission for approval. In order to avoid repeating some of the difficulties that were encountered during the approval process of the 2007 Pathways Master Plan, staff has identified a need to develop a stakeholder outreach plan to guide the public rollout of the proposed project list and shepherd the document through the adoption process. Teton County Public Works posted a Request for Qualifications on the Public Purchase web platform on May 31, 2022. One proposal was received by the June 13, 2022 deadline from Flitner Strategies, Inc (FSI).

Public comment was given by Tim Young.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Newcomb to continue consideration of the contract for the Teton Mobility Project to the July 19, 2022 Board of County Commissioners Meeting. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

13. Consideration of Pari-Mutuel Horse Betting Resolution – CONTINUED FROM THE JUNE 7, 2022 MEETING

Abigail Moore, Deputy County Attorney, presented to the Board for consideration of approval a resolution to approve 307 Horse Racing, Inc. to conduct Pari-Mutuel Wagering on Live Horseracing, Historic Horse Racing, and Simulcast Event within Teton County, Wyoming.

Wyoming Statutes, Title 11, Chapter 25 allows for Pari-Mutuel Wagering on horse racing. The voters of Teton County voted in 1973 to allow Pari-Mutuel Wagering in Teton County. 307 Horse Racing, Inc. would like to conduct pari-mutuel wagering within the Hole Bowl establishment located at 980 West Broadway in Jackson, Wyoming.

This matter was on the BCC agenda on June 7, 2022 and was continued to July 5, 2022 to allow for further review. The applicant has submitted a new resolution for consideration with two new conditions:

- Condition 1: the gaming area inside the Premises containing any and all historic horse racing terminals which allow for pari-mutuel wagering shall be segregated by sight (i.e. visually) and by internal egress from the remaining portion of the Premises; and,
- Condition 2: the remaining area of the Premises shall be operated in a first class manner and shall provide segregated access (by sight, i.e. visual, and by internal ingress and egress) to an entertainment venue for individuals that are 18 years of age or under to engage in, i.e. bowling or other age appropriate activities.

Kyle Ridgeway and Jack Greer of 307 Horse Racing commented on the proposal.

Public comment was given by Patrick Spencer.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to approve the Resolution to approving 307 Horse Racing Inc. to Conduct Pari-Mutuel Wagering on Live Horse Racing, Historic Horse Racing, and Simulcast Event within Teton County, Wyoming with the two conditions in the staff report, and a third condition, that hours of operation shall be seven days a week from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. (midnight). Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed two in favor and the motion failed 2-3 with Commissioners Macker, Newcomb, and Propst opposed.

The meeting recessed at 10:09 a.m. and reconvened at 10:26 a.m.

MATTERS FROM PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order:

1. MSC2022-0026 - JHHR HOLDINGS I LLC

Abigail Moore, Deputy County Attorney, presented to the Board for consideration of approval the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law for MSC2022-0026, a request to amend condition of approval #7 of Sketch Plan SKC2020-0001, which would allow the use of the sketch plan on an adjacent parcel of land concurrent with a separate zoning map amendment application ZMA2022-0002. This matter was considered at the Board of County Commissioners meeting on June 7th 2022.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner to approve the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law granting approval for MSC2022-0026. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed four in favor and the motion carried 4-0 with Chairwoman Macker abstaining.

2. MSC2022-0018 - TARGHEE VILLAGE, INC. C/O RHOLAND E. LANGE

Abigail Moore, Deputy County Attorney, presented to the Board for consideration of approval the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law for MSC2022-0018, a Miscellaneous Planning Request to amend a Development Permit Condition of Approval. This matter was considered at the June 21st 2022 County Commissioners hearing.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Newcomb to approve the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law denying approval of MSC2022-0018. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed four in favor and the motion carried 4-0 with Chairwoman Macker abstaining.

3. CUP2022-0001 - DIAMOND CROSS RANCH LLC

Abigail Moore, Deputy County Attorney, presented to the Board for consideration of approval the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law for CUP2022-0001, a Conditional Use Permit for amendment and expansion to the Diamond Cross Ranch reception site use. This matter was considered at the June 21st, 2022 County Commissioners hearing.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Newcomb and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to approve the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and order granting approval for CUP2022-0001. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed four in favor and the motion carried 4-0 with Chairwoman Macker abstaining.

- 4. Permit:** MSC2022-0041
Applicant: TETON VILLAGE WATER & SEWER DISTRICT
Presenter: Chandler Windom
Request: Request to waive all Commercial Building Permit and Grading & Erosion Control fees for the improvements to the Teton Village Water & Sewer Treatment Plan Expansion Project, pursuant to finding 2.b of the Teton County Fee Waiver Policy (Resolution 2014-054).
Location: The Teton Village Water & Sewer Facility at 7020 N Rachel Way, also Lots 171 & 172 of the Jackson Hole Ski Corps 9th Filing. The site is zoned Planned Unit Development-Planned Resort for Teton Village Area I and is partially in the Scenic Resources Overlay.

Chandler Windom, Senior Planner, presented to the Board for consideration of approval a Fee Waiver to Waive all Commercial Building Permit and Grading & Erosion Control fees for the improvements to the Teton Village Water & Sewer Treatment Plan Expansion Project, pursuant to finding 2.b of the Teton County Fee Waiver Policy (Resolution 2014-054).

The Teton Village Water & Sewer District (TV WSD Public Works) is requesting a fee waiver for the Commercial Building Permits and Grading & Erosion Control Permit for the expansion project to the wastewater treatment plant at 7020 N Rachel Way. The Teton Village Water and Sewer District provides water and sewer service and related infrastructure in Teton Village, including Granite Ridge and Shooting Star. The applicant stated the following in their fee waiver application: Request to waive Building and GEC permitting fees for the Teton Village Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion Project based on the fact it complies with applicable policy given it is an application brought by a government entity.

Josh Kilpatrick, the applicant, commented on the application.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to approve the Teton Village Water & Sewer District's Fee Waiver Request MSC2022-0041, received May 6, 2022, for \$7,954.40 as associated with Planning and Building permits BDC2022-0012, BDC2022-0013, BDC2022-0014 and GEC2022-0082, being able to make finding 2.b of the Teton County Fee Waiver Policy (Resolution 2014-054). Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

- 5. Permit:** MSC2020-0022
Applicant: TETON COUNTY, WYOMING
Presenter: Ryan Hostetter
Request: The Board of County Commissioners will meet to review the Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan for review and/or adoption.
Location: Northern South Park Subarea 5.6

Ryan Hostetter, Senior Long-Range Planner, presented to the Board for consideration of approval acceptance of the Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan.

On July 21, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners approved the FY21 Comprehensive Plan Work Plan with the inclusion of the Subarea 5.6 Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan. On August 24, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners gave direction for staff to prepare a Request for Proposals, and was subsequently approved on September 14, 2020 and issued on September 21, 2020. The contract was awarded to Opticos Design, Inc on November 2, 2020 and a formal contract was signed on November 17, 2020. The Project Team kick-off was on December 2, 2020 and the Board of County Commissioners appointing a steering committee on December 8, 2020. Throughout 2021 and 2022, the Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan was created. The draft proposed Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan was presented during a joint meeting of the Town of Jackson Planning Commission and the Teton County Planning Commission on May 18, 2022. Then the draft was presented during a joint meeting of the Jackson Town Council and the Teton County Board of County Commissioners on June 6, 2022. The purpose of that meeting was to open the discussion with the elected officials and gather feedback on issues which would be brought back during individual meetings with each board separately. Several questions were raised by both the Town Council and Board of County Commissioners about the data behind the plan including items specific to the overall density, job impacts, transportation, and exactions. Today's presentation includes answers to those questions (see outline in Staff Report).

Drew Finke, Opticos Design, commented on the application

Comments were made by Gillian Chapman, TCSD #1 Superintendent, regarding the impact of additional housing on school capacity.

Additional public comment was made by Anne Cresswell, Robbin Levy Mommsen, Susan Johnson, Amberley Baker, Chris Deming, Nichole Gill, Chris Elsey, Esther Judge Lennox, and Claire Stumpf.

The meeting recessed at 12:00 p.m. and reconvened at 1:33 p.m.

Tyler Sinclair, Town Community Development Director, answered questions from the Board.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to accept the Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan dated April of 2022 and attached to the staff report with the intention of this board that the plan includes the opportunity to increase overall density up to 1800 units through zoning that would increase the deed restriction to a base of 70%.

Commissioner Barron withdrew his motion.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to accept the Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan dated April of 2022 and attached to the staff report with the following amendment:

- Developer could increase the total unit count to 1800 units, 1,682 new units on top of the 118 existing entitlement; additional units beyond 1200 new will be deed restricted on a sliding scale which shall be created through the zoning tool (with a minimum deed restriction to exceed 70%).

Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

MATTERS FROM COMMISSION

- A. Calendar Review – the Board reviewed upcoming meetings.

ADJOURN

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Barron to adjourn. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 2:54 p.m.
