Animal Bedding at the Fair

The first bedding of shavings **ONLY** will be provided free of charge for all 4-H livestock animals by the Fair Board.

Any additional shavings must be provided by the 4-H clubs or individual 4-Hers.

VET INSPECTION INFORMATION

Livestock:

Vet inspections will be done on **Wednesday, July 27th** starting at 11 a.m. on Snow King Ave. in front of the Fairgrounds. Animals will remain in their trailers during the vet inspection. Vehicles trailering animals should approach the Fairgrounds on the west side via Snow King Ave. Vehicles will be traveling east and vet inspections will take place in front of the Rodeo Arena/Heritage arena. Vehicles will then enter the fairgrounds through the East Gate and travel to the Heritage Arena to drop off livestock. Any animals not passing the vet inspection will be asked to leave the fairgrounds at that time. In order to make this process run smoothly, please arrive at the Fairgrounds with your animals based on your club's scheduled time.



VET INSPECTION INFORMATION

Vet inspections will be done on the fairgrounds, in the **Grassy Arena** beginning at **7 a.m. until 8 a.m. on Tuesday, July 26th, 2011**. Once you arrive on the Fairgrounds, please immediately take your horse to the **Grassy Arena** where a vet inspection station will be set up. Any horse participating in the 4-H Horse Show on Tuesday or Wednesday will be inspected during this time. The cost for vet inspection will be \$10 per horse. Any horse not passing the vet inspection, will not be shown that day, and will be asked to leave the fairgrounds at that time. The 4-H Horse Show will start at **9 a.m. on Tuesday, July 26th**. Horses will not be inspected again on Wednesday.



Wyoming 4-H Horse ID and Safety Certification

Reminder! One Wyoming 4-H Horse ID and Safety Certification needs to be completed for each horse a youth intends to learn and compete with prior to the Teton County Fair entry deadline or 4-H endorsed show. Certification should be done by a trained key leader who is not the parent of the child. The process is progressive. Complete Section 1, then 2A, then 2B, then individual endorsements.



VET INSPECTION INFORMATION

Rabbits:

Vet inspections will take place at **2:30 p.m. on Wednesday July 27th in the Heritage Arena.** Once animals are inspected, they can then be placed in pens. Any animals not passing the vet inspection will be asked to leave the fairgrounds at that time.

4-H General Project Information

Interview judging is encouraged for all members entering projects in the Exhibit Hall. Youth will meet with the judge and learn how the project is judged. The Judge will also ask questions about the project; this is not a presentation.

Judging will be on **Monday, July 25th this year for all projects**. Fabric and Fashion projects will be judged at the 4-H Office, all other Exhibit Projects will be judged at the Exhibit Hall on the Fairgrounds.

Each member will spend approximately 10 minutes with the Judge. If you do not appear for interview judging, your project will still be judged, **however the interview is 60% of your judging score. The project quality is 40% of your judging score.**

Tips for Creating Great 4-H Exhibits

1. Be sure to read all rules about your project in the Teton County Fair Book.
2. Be creative! Unique exhibits are fun for judges to look at and make an impression.
3. If doing a poster, always sketch out a rough draft first, before you glue.
 4. Use colors. Your exhibit should attract attention.
5. Use techniques like framing and shadowing to make your pictures or artwork stand out.
6. Use rubber cement or spray adhesive. White glue makes bubbles and glue sticks don't always stick.
7. Keep your exhibit clean and straight. Use a pencil lightly so you can erase extra marks.

4-H Silent Auction

Back by popular demand. Here's your chance to market and sell some of your 4-H Projects!!



Criteria to be in sale:

1. Must be a currently enrolled 4-H member
2. Can sell two (2) exhibits per person, but only one per project—**No food projects permitted!**
3. All items in the sale must have been judged in the 4-H division
4. Items must be in place by Tuesday of the Fair by the entry deadline or it will not be sold.
5. 4-H member (seller) must contact the buyer to make the transaction of goods, provide receipt and thank you note.
6. Sellers must pay 1.25% of their profit back to the 4-H Office. This is due when Record Books are due.
7. Sellers may put a marketing card on their item while it is on display for sale. Maximum size is a letter sized paper (8 1/2 x 11 in.)
8. Silent Auction will run from when the Exhibit Hall opens through **Sunday at 5 p.m.** of the Fair.

4-H Fabric and Fashion Information

Judging for Fabric and Fashion members will take place on **Monday, July 25, 2011 at the 4-H Office**. Be sure to bring the following with you to judging:

- Your sewn garments/items
- Narration Script - Write a brief description of each ensemble you will be modeling. 4-H Leaders will read the description for their members while they model for the judges and the scripts will then be used for the public Fashion Revue in the evening. (mailed to you)
- Fashion Review Application (mailed to you)

2011 TETON COUNTY FAIR NEWS

The Teton County Fair Office will again be issuing permits to camp on the fairgrounds during the Teton County Fair. The spaces are located just north of the grassy arena. The permit will cost \$10 and will be available in the Fair Office beginning Monday, July 18 at 8:00 a.m. for Moran and Alta families **ONLY**. Beginning Wednesday, July 20 at 8:00 a.m., Kelly, Moose, and Hoback families **ONLY** may purchase their permits. Beginning Monday, July 25 at 8:00 a.m., other families will be allowed to purchase permits. We will most likely sell out of permits at some time. You will not be allowed to park your camping vehicle on the fairgrounds prior to getting a permit or before Monday, July 25. There is a limit of one (1) permit per 4-H family. Remember, camping at the fair was originally approved for 4-Hers who must travel a long distance each day and space is limited.

There will be no through traffic allowed from the west part of the fairgrounds to the east part and vice versa. All horse trailers should enter from the west side of the fairgrounds off of Flat Creek Drive and exit on to Flat Creek Drive or Snow King Avenue.

Again this year, the first bedding of shavings **ONLY** will be provided free of charge for all 4-H livestock animals. Any additional shavings must be provided by the 4-H clubs or individual 4-Hers.

Stalls for 4-H horses will be available free of charge in the pavilion until noon on Wednesday, July 27. Please call the Fair Office to reserve your stalls.

Horse trailers will only be allowed at the Heritage Arena to load and unload animals. If you need to leave a horse trailer on the fairgrounds overnight, please park it in the large parking lot on the far west side of the fairgrounds (south of the carnival).

Food and drink will not be allowed in the Heritage Arena, except in the enclosed concession area. Ecoli is a huge concern these days and the Teton County Fair Board is committed to enforcing preventive measures.

Again this year, you will be required to take your manure out the east Heritage Arena door to a dumpster located in that area. You will not be allowed to move manure through the north doors. These are the doors where most of the visitors enter.

System for 4-H Fair Awards

We will continue to use the system from last year to determine the number of trophies and buckles given out at the Teton County Fair for 4-H Contests. This system is based on member enrollment. The following is the criteria for determining this number of awards given per project.

Trophies/buckles per number of kids:

0-4 kids in project: 0 Trophies

5-10 kids in project: 1 Grand and 1 Reserve (Overall)

11-20 kids in project: 1 Grand per age group

21 and up kids in project: 1 Grand and 1 Reserve per age group

Please make plans now to attend State Fair if you should win a trip. **The Office needs to know immediately following County Fair if you plan to attend.** The Fair Board sponsors 4-H members to attend. Sponsorship pays for registration, stall fees, and dorm lodging. Mileage will not be paid for.

There will be a **meeting of all those attending State Fair at 5:30 p.m. on August 9 at the 4-H Office.** A parent must be present with each 4-H member. This meeting is **MANDATORY.** Parents, we will need a male and female chaperone for the dorms. If you can help, please let us know. Wyoming State Fair Books are available at: www.wystatefair.com.

STATE FAIR RULING: All warm blooded animals to be exhibited at the State Fair must have a valid health certificate in order to enter the State Fairgrounds. Rabbits must have a certificate issued within the past 48 hours; all other animals must have a certificate issued within the past 30 days. The Health Certificate must list State Fair as the destination. The health certificate check point will be located by the Cowboy Gate in Pepsi parking lot at the SE corner of the Fairgrounds.

Please turn in Exhibit Projects to State Fair to the 4-H Office by August 8th.

We would like to ask for volunteers to take 4-H Exhibits to State Fair. If you would like to do this, contact the 4-H Office at 733-3087.

State Fair Chaperone Information

Chaperones:

Teton County Fair Board provides funds for adult chaperones attending state fair. Chaperones must be staying in the dorm for the entire week. Dorm, parking and cafeteria fees will be provided. The number of scholarships provided will be based on the number of youth staying in the dorms. Chaperones will be chosen on a first come, first served basis.

1 – 7 youth = 1 chaperone
 8—15 youth = 2 chaperones
 16 and up = 3 chaperones


Record Books DUE AUGUST 31st by 5 p.m. in the 4-H Office


4-H Club's Yearly Book

The 4-H Year is wrapping up. Youth will be finishing up their Record Books and this year, clubs will be turning in the 4-H Club's Yearly Book. These are due August 31st (the same day Record Books are due).

Your 4-H Club's Yearly Book helps complete the chartering process for the year. 4-H programs in every state are responsible to the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture through National 4-H Headquarters. At their direction, Wyoming 4-H requires the chartering of all 4-H Clubs and Committees.

The chartering process helps your club set goals, plan educational programs, and measure progress throughout the year. As a way to strengthen this process, you have been provided support pieces to help conclude this year by sitting down with your members and evaluating what has been accomplished, celebrate success and identify ways to expand and grow next year.

Your 4-H Club's Yearly Book was designed to serve as an organizational tool to record yearly accomplishments. Your clubs are doing great work and these reporting pieces will allow you to celebrate your club's accomplishments. It also allows the County and State 4-H Programs to keep a history of 4-H clubs' progress over the years.



What is due by August 31st?
