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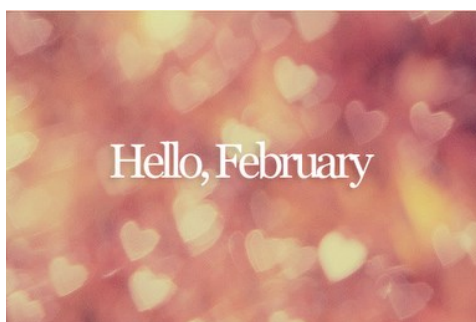

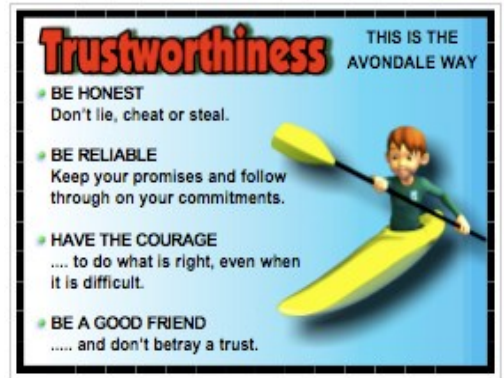

Character Counts Trustworthiness

Being trusted is among the highest achievements of individuals and corporations.



What does it mean to be Trustworthy?

People will trust a person who has a reputation of being honest, reliable and responsible.

Dishonesty can easily tarnish that reputation, such that others consider you untrustworthy. Being considered trustworthy provides benefits from the way people deal with you, as well as your own self-esteem.

Trust in another people has several meanings:

1. Trust means that you feel that the person is honest and will not lie, cheat or steal from you.
2. It also means that you can count on the person to do as he or she promised and that the person is reliable.

Finally, trust in a person means that you feel he or she can be counted on to do something important, will not shirk from duties, and will take personal

- ◆ You keep your word
- ◆ You are reliable
- ◆ You return things you borrow
- ◆ You don't gossip

Trustworthiness:

involves four major qualities:

1. Integrity: the idea of a moral wholeness, or oneness, demonstrated by a consistency of thoughts, words, deeds, and duties.
2. Honesty: means that a person doesn't do things that are morally wrong. If something you do is breaking the law or you have to hide it because you'll get in trouble, you are probably not being honest.
3. Promise-keeping: A man is only as good as his word
4. Loyalty: standing with and behind someone in need. Loyal friends share both triumphs and trauma, and offer honest, constructive feedback delivered in a kind and tactful manner.

C.C. Moseley 4-H Scholarship

You may be eligible to apply for this scholarship. To be eligible, you must be a resident of Teton County, WY and have earned credit for 4-H each year of High School, and have completed a minimum of five (5) years of 4-H club work, enrolled in 4-H at the time of the application, and completed 4-H for as many Senior years as eligible (**earning at least Silver Recognition**). This means you have completed and turned in a Record Book by the deadline, attended 60% of club meetings, and exhibited your project for each of your senior years.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEWS

Towards a Healthier and Wealthier New Year

There are no "magic bullets" that guarantee health and wealth. But daily progress will build upon itself, just like compound interest. If you do something consistently, at least 5 times a week, you will make steady progress. Each little step adds to the ones before it and, what you think about, you bring about! Happy New Year!!

Daily Health Behaviors:

- Avoid drinking sugar-sweetened beverages (e.g., regular soda and sweetened waters and iced teas) Water is what our body needs to quench thirst.
- Eat 7 to 9 servings of fruits and vegetables daily
- Get at least 7 hours of sleep per night
- Eat an adequate amount of fiber
- Consume less than 1,500 mg of sodium per day
- Eat foods low in fat, saturated fat, and cholesterol
- Get at least 30 minutes of physical activity at least 5 days per week.

Daily Financial Behaviors:

- Follow a written spending plan (budget) for spending and saving money
- Save at least \$1 per day and/or loose change in a savings account and/or a can or jar
- Avoid using payday loans, car title loans, pawn shop loans, cash advances, and other high-cost debt
- Eat at least two meals a day prepared at home instead of at a deli or restaurant
- Use advertisements, apps, coupons, promo codes, sales, and/or discounts to save money on purchases
- Do something proactive every day to save money or reduce expense

Financial Literacy... Monthly Action steps

Many dates are predictable in the world of personal finance. For example "tax season" always occurs during the first quarter of each year and December 31 is the last day of each calendar year to make charitable donations for itemized deductions. Sometimes we are so busy that it is easy to forget financial milestone dates or the best times to take certain actions. Below is a list of recommended action steps for each month of the year:

January: Start the year off right by reviewing your financial situation with an updated net worth statement. Determine the value of what you own (assets) and what do you owe (debts) as well as how much income you earn and where it goes. Also pay the IRS your final estimated tax payment for the previous year, if applicable.

February: Organize tax documents to prepare your federal and state income tax returns. Make an appointment with a tax preparer or buy tax preparation software, if needed. If you haven't already done so, fund your last year's IRA this month or next so you're not rushing to do this right before the April tax filing deadline.
